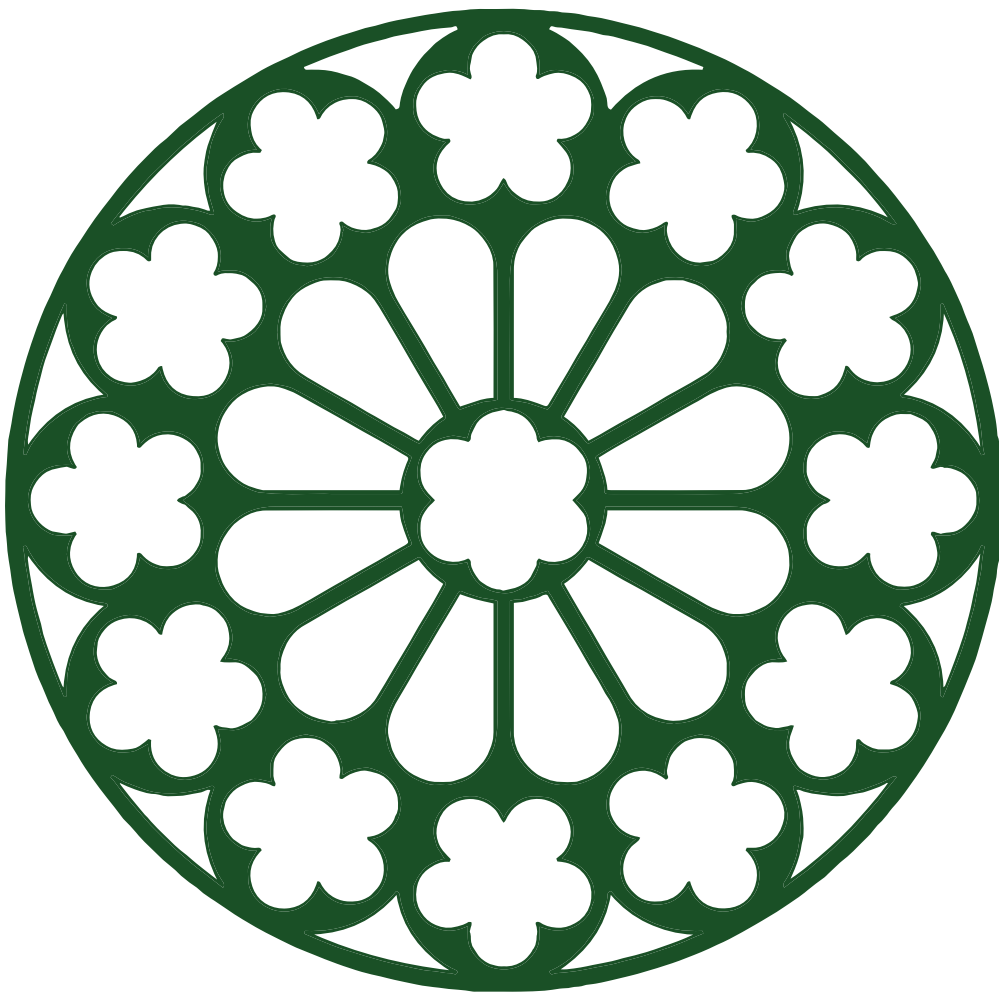

Yours is the kingdom, O Lord, and you are exalted as head above all.

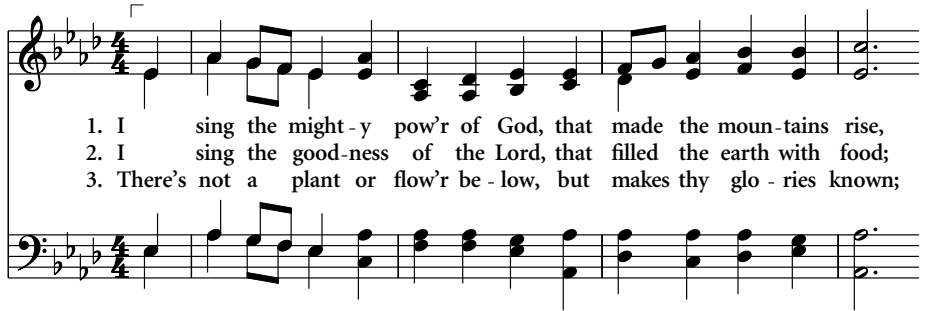

And I will vindicate the holiness of my great name, which has been profaned among the nations, and which you have profaned among them. And the nations will know that I am the LORD, declares the Lord GOD, when through you I vindicate my holiness before their eyes. I will take you from the nations and gather you from all the countries and bring you into your own land. I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you shall be clean from all your uncleannesses, and from all your idols I will cleanse you. And I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. And I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put my Spirit within you, and cause you to walk in my statutes and be careful to obey my rules.”

The Gloria Patri is a Trinitarian doxology with roots in the early Christian Church, likely dating back to the 2nd–4th centuries. It is used to praise the Triune God and is often appended to psalms, canticles, and other liturgical texts in Christian worship. The phrase "as it was in the beginning" was added in the 4th century to counter the Arian heresy, affirming the co-eternal nature of the Son and Spirit with the Father. The tune GREATOREX was written by Henry Greatorex (1813–1858), an English-born church musician who immigrated to the United States in 1839.

Within the context of our relationship with God, we are invited in safety, not in shame, to consider our sins.

God loves us in spite of our sins. We rehearse this truth each week by confessing our sins corporately and leaning into his renewal, restoration, and cleansing.

The Scripture that follows our confession assures us of God's forgiveness, grace, and pardon. This is the good news.

Teach us not only to know your word, but how to live and die by it. May your Spirit illumine our lives, and lead us in paths of righteousness for your name's sake.

The Doxology, often sung to the tune OLD HUNDREDTH, is a short hymn of praise traditionally used in Christian worship.

The lyrics were written by Thomas Ken in 1674, originally as the final stanza of his hymn "Awake, My Soul, and with the Sun." It has been traditionally used in thanksgiving, such as confession, the offering, or the close of worship. The tune OLD HUNDREDTH was composed by Louis Bourgeois for the Genevan Psalter (1551), originally for Psalm 134, though commonly associated with Psalm 100 in English hymnals.

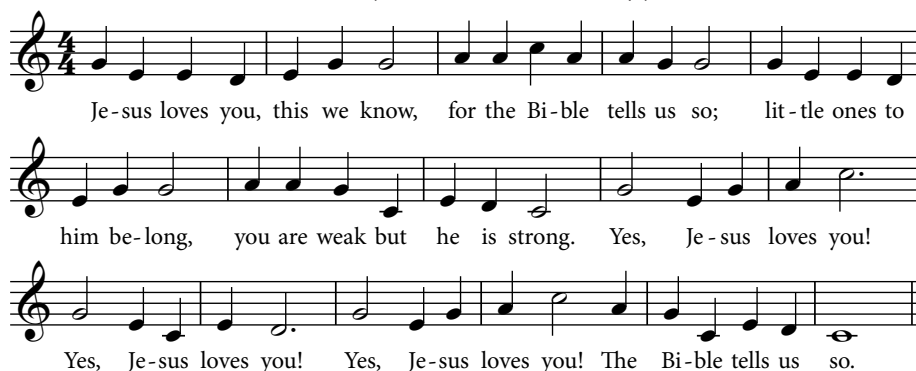

It is right and good and a joyful thing, always and everywhere to give thanks unto you, O Lord, Holy Father, Almighty, Everlasting God. Therefore, with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify your glorious name, evermore praising you and singing...

Communion is a holy sacrament of the Church. The word "sacrament" is a translation of a Greek word which means "mystery." Baptism and communion are the "mysteries" of the Church that God uses to powerfully nourish our faith. Communion is not just a ritual or a memorial, it is a fellowship with the risen Christ.

We invite all who are baptized Christians and members in good standing of a gospel-believing church to come forward, if you are able, to receive the sacrament. You may commune immediately or return to your seat to commune. If you are unable to come forward, a pastor will be available to serve you where you are. (Baptized children can only eat and drink after they have made a profession of faith approved by the session. If you would like to know more, please reach out to one of our pastors or elders.)

For those not communing, we are glad you are here! We invite you, including non-communing children, to participate by coming forward to receive a simple gospel blessing. Or you may choose to remain in the pew for meditation and prayer; the prayers on the following page may help you formulate your prayer to God.
